### Congratulations Mrs Sirisisavath

We are so excited to announce that Mrs Sirisisavath has been awarded the 2014 ASG National Excellence in Teaching State and Territory Award.

Mrs Sirisisavath was nominated by parents for her innovative teaching of technology in primary classrooms. At Zig Zag Public School for only a short time, she has worked with the staff and students to successfully implement new technology goals.

As a specialist teacher, Mrs teaches from Kindergarten to Year 6, and has set up log-in keyring cards for students to manage their usernames and passwords to web-based programs. Some of the programs she uses with students include Storybird, Glogster, Studyladder, Word Mania, Wikispaces, Wordle, Bubb.us and Voki.

Online learning spaces in Wikispaces have also proved popular, and Mrs Savath uses them to support learning, classroom experiences and excursions. She has students learning in a scaffolded online environment and using social media to interact about the content in the Wikispace and the classroom.

Teaching the students to touch type was a beneficial activity, and Mrs Savath also introduced the use of web-based Class Dojo for behaviour management.

She has led the staff's professional development in technology by introducing an 'An App a Week' to increase her colleagues' confidence and to help them use the school's iPods.

Mrs Savath is also a learning support teacher and has taken the lead in a review of the whole school maths program. She is currently in the process of writing a new program that will take into account resource management, sequence of learning concepts, and the requirements of the new maths syllabus.

Well done Mrs Savath! How fortunate we are at Zig Zag to have such talented staff.
