- •There is currently a terrifying challenge, that is popping up in the middle of Children's Videos and content in YouTube, including innocent videos such a Peppa Pig, Frozen and toy reviews.
- •It is also circulating through social media channels such as Facebook, SnapChat, Instagram and TikTok.
- •It is also present in the chat sections of games such as MineCraft and Fortnight.
- •The Momo Challenge consists of a grotesque character has now taken on a life of its own - and the fear children may experience is real. The character brings disturbing messages and challenges asking children to do terrifying and violent acts including suicide.
- •Please be aware that children online may be exposed
- •There is no quick fast way to prevent exposure, so we recommend careful supervision.


